## **N. V. ALUMNI SCHOLARSHIP SELECTION PROCESS**

In **January**, the high school counselor distributes the applications for the scholarship to every high school senior interested in applying. They have until **March 15th** to return the application and their essay to the school counselor. The essay is not signed. A number is given to the application and to the essay and any other item that is attached.

The Scholarship Committee sets a time to meet. They evaluate the essays and score them (30 points being the best possible score). The committee does not know who wrote the essay and assigns the essay score to the number given to the essay. They then score the application forms (10 points being the best possible score). Financial need is then evaluated using data given to them by the school counselor, such as other scholarships that the students have won and qualification for state aid. (30 points can be scored in this area). The 3 totals are added together to determine a winner.

The committee also decides how many scholarships to give and the amount to give, based on the current funds available.

The students are issued a cashier's check when they are ready to enroll in school. (This has been adjusted when awarded additional memorial money. They may be required to have a transcript sent to the scholarship chairperson before a check will be issued to the college the recipient is attending).
